



## Cynthia Clark Stewart

Cynthia (“Cindy”) Clark Stewart, 84, of Lexington, formerly of Grosse Ile, and most recently of Las Vegas, Nevada, passed away peacefully in the company of family on May 9, 2025. A devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and sister, Cindy was predeceased by her beloved husband of 49 years, George D.
