CROSWELL- Frank Alvin Monzo, age 91, of Croswell, went home to meet the Lord Thursday, June 24, 2021 at home surrounded by family.

He was born May 18, 1930 in Sanilac Twp., son of the late Frank and Mary (Butler) Monzo. Frank married Lucy Jane Parker on June 25, 1949 in Croswell.

Frank retired from Ford Motor Company as a project engineer. Frank was a long-time member of Disco/Hope United Methodist Church, then Applegate United Methodist Church where he was active in many capacities and sang in the choir.
