CROSWELL- John C. "Jack" Williams, age 72, a lifelong resident of Croswell passed away very unexpectedly of an apparent heart attack at his home on Wednesday, October 11, 2023.

He was born on June 16, 1951 in Croswell, a son of the late Dr. Charles and Elizabeth (Kohl) Williams. Jack married Christine A. Shock on May 31, 1975 in Port Huron.

Jack retired from the City of Croswell as Superintendent of the Croswell Light and Power utility municipality.
