



Keith A. "Bud" Waun

March 10, 1929 - December 8, 2016

PORT SANILAC Age 87, died Thursday, December 8, 2016 at McKenzie Hospital, Sandusky.

He was born March 10, 1929 in Deckerville, son of the late Orville and Mildred (Bugbee) Waun. He and Marguerite Smith were married on May 5, 1953 in Dearborn. She died December 27, 2010.

Bud was a Korean War veteran of the U.S. Navy. He operated his barber shop in Port Sanilac for 45 years. He was a member of Ave Maria Parish- St. Marys Catholic Church and the Ushers Club. He was a member of Port Sanilac V.F.W. Post #8872 Port Sanilac. Bud also enjoyed playing euchre.

Surviving are sons Darnell (Jolene) of San Antonio, TX, and Dennis (Shari) of Bad Axe; daughters Karen Waun of Port Sanilac, Pamela (Scott) Burger of Carsonville, and Linda (Mike Garavaglia) Waun of Deckerville; brother Richard (Cathy) of Port Sanilac; 13 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his son Robert, sister Donna, and great granddaughter, Jocelyn Luna.

Funeral Mass will be 11 AM Monday, December 12 at Ave Maria Parish St. Mary Catholic Church, Port Sanilac. Fr. Donald J. Eppenbrock will officiate.

“ Bud was my oldest cousin. Last Summer after my car broke down in his driveway, and he was out of town watching a Chippewa's Football Game, he returned home the next day. I dropped by the house and he couldn't have been more gracious, inviting me in for a beer. His brother Richard fixed the problem with my car by tugging on the steering wheel and un-locking the mechanism that kept me from starting the car. What a dummy I felt like!

The next day he picked me up in his car and we drove to Deckerville to have breakfast. Everyone in the little restaurant knew Bud, and stopped by the table to greet him -- he was such an easy-going friendly fellow. After breakfast we drove by the home where Grandpa and Grandma Waun and all the aunts and uncles grew up. Also, we drove by where Uncle Cliff lived and where we had some Waun Reunions when I was just a kid, Then we went out to the Cemetery to find Grandpa and Grandma's graves, as well as the graves of our great grandparents. (My infant Brother Charles was buried in our Great Grandmother's grave as well.) Then we drove out to where the farm was where he had lived before moving to town. He was so proud of that place and freely told of all the good times he had there.

He recalled when my folks (His Uncle Bob and Aunt June) came out to the farm with their motor home to stay for a time. He also told a few stories about when he and all the Uncles used to go up deer hunting at Uncle Gene's cabin -- stories about eating chili and lots of tricks they all played on each other while laughing their fool heads off. Bud mentioned the family reunions my sister Judy hosted at her cabin on Lake Huron, and told of the good times there. I shared my memories of visiting his father (Orville -- but whom we all called Uncle "Baldy") at his little apartment behind the barber shop. All in all we had a great visit that day, and like my brother Chuck, who I talked with this morning, we will always cherish our memories of Bud, his pleasant nature and sense of humor, and his hospitality. Bud was so proud of his kids that he a Marguerite had raised to be good Catholics who love the Lord, and he talked about each of them with a gleam in his eye and great warmth in his heart.

Bud was the last of the family who grew up with Grandma and Grandpa Waun and all the Uncles and Aunts. He was all that was wonderful about that old Waun family -- and you could see in him the personality, the character, the humor, and the values that we Waun's can call our proud heritage for generations to come.

Both my brother Chuck and I are deeply saddened at his passing, but we are heartened by the knowledge that Bud loved our Lord Jesus Christ, who has prepared a place for him in Heaven. As I left Bud that day I told him we would meet again, Here, There, or in the Air. And so may it be on the last day.
