



## Lynn M. Laughlin

February 7, 1949 - April 3, 2016

Lynn Marie Laughlin, age 67, died Sunday, April 3, 2016 after a long battle with cancer; while being attended to at the Blue Water Hospice Home in Marysville, Michigan.

Lynn was born on February 7, 1949 in Detroit, Michigan. She was the firstborn child of Donald and Betty Asher, previously of Deckerville, Michigan.

Moving to Lexington in 1976, Lynn was very active in Sanilac County, especially the Lexington community which she proudly served. She played a large role in local politics - giving many years acting as the Lexington Village Manager, holding positions on the Village Council, Downtown Development Authority, Planning Commission, and also as Zoning Administrator for Lexington & Worth Townships and most recently for the Village of Lexington. She participated in various groups and organizations including Sanilac County Kid's Connection, Sanilac County Community of Mental Health Board, and Eva's Place Women's Shelter. Being a huge advocate of the area, she excelled at and enjoyed making her community a better place for everyone to live, work and play. She was a member of St. Matthew Lutheran Church and was active in the local business community as an owner of Lexington Valero. She was a loving wife, mother and sister - being survived by her husband of 46 years, Charles "Cal" Laughlin III, as well as two sons: Charles "Chuck" Laughlin IV and Michael Laughlin, and her father, Donald Asher. By four sisters: Gail (George) Innis, Donna (Mark) Randall, Patti (Burt) Cowan, and Jane (Tom) Reaney, and one brother, Thomas Asher - as well as a large

extended family.

She is preceded in death by her mother, Betty Asher.

A memorial service will be held 11:30 AM Thursday, April 7 at St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Lexington. The Rev. Barry Sheldon will officiate. Lynn requested to be cremated and her remains will be interred at Lexington Municipal Cemetery. Memorial donations may be made to St. Matthew Lutheran Church.
